


# Who is considered a contact of an active case?




Those living in the same household of an individual diagnosed as an active COVID-19 case



Colleagues that have interacted with an active COVID-19 case on a daily basis in the workplace for a period of more than 15 minutes and have been within a distance of less than two meters with the active case without wearing a face mask



All who have had direct contact with an active COVID-19 case (for example: shaking hands, touching anything at the same place, exposure to bodily fluids and cough/sneeze droplets)



All who have been in a closed environment with an active COVID-19 case (for example: classrooms, meeting rooms, hospital waiting rooms, etc.)

# Who is considered a contact of an active case?



A health care worker, or anyone else providing direct health care to an active COVID-19 case, or laboratory workers who handle COVID-19 samples without wearing the recommended Personal Protective Equipment (PPE), or in case of a possible breach in the PPE



Those who have been in an airplane, bus, car, or any other mode of transportation, and sitting two seats away (in any direction) from an active COVID-19 case, including travel companions, medical care providers, and the crew or driver present



If symptoms are severe or indicate extensive exposure, all passengers travelling by that mode of transportation with the index case (plane, bus, car, etc.) may be considered as close contacts
